GENERAL INFORMATION

All boxers and coaches must be registered before the start of the tournament. We cannot make books out at the bouts. Remember your passbook is your ticket to get into the bouts. If you do not have your passbook, you will not get in the event for free, you will have to purchase a ticket.

DIVISIONS

Open boxers are between the age of 18 and 40 and must be 18 by the first day of our tournament. Anyone can enter the open division in Golden Gloves, even those with no bouts but remember, once they enter the open division, they will always be open class boxers.

PASSBOOKS

All boxers must have a Passbook to box in the Golden Gloves. Renewing boxers can go online to USA Boxing to register and print their membership (put it in your Passbook). New members must go to USA Boxing to register. Send your birth certificate, two pictures and physical form to Vickie Elder.

PHYSICALS

All boxers must have a physical form filled out and in the back of their passbook. Physicals are good for 12 months. If the current physical form is not in their passbook, they will not be allowed to box.

NATIONALS

The National Tournament will be held this year from May 8 through May 13 in Chester, PA. We will take the open class champions to the nationals as long as they have a bout at the state tournament. If you have a boxer who is unopposed and wants to go, they will have to pay their own way.
